Dear _____ and _____,

T.U.S.C. is a club for those "into" or curious about our Published range of interests.

Having taken the trouble to make this enquiry, it is not unreasonable for us to assume that this is true in your case.

T.U.S.C. is unique in a lot of ways, some of general help to individuals seeking others, some of help to groups seeking new members, some to assist members who find it difficult to express their (real) needs AND some of particular help to couples.

(1), Mixed couples are often seeking either other couples OR young (straight OR gay) females. Most clubs (& Contact Agencies) refuse to accept this - we do our very best to take this into account.

(2), another factor which makes it difficult to satisfy all couples is the problem of "taste disparity". What this means is that it is often "very" difficult for one half of the couple to be entirely "honest" about their tastes - for fear of upsetting their partner.

(3), in almost "all" instances of "Swinging", "Swapping" or "Menage'a Trois" one partner will gain far more than the other, and this situation can lead to considerable bad feelings.

(4), in Sub/Dom couples, the Dominant partner tends to be Very "Possessive" and also usually tends toward severe jealousy should the Sub partner (or a Third Person) be seeming to be having a "better" time than they are. If the Third Person "also" happens to be Dominant then all the ingredients necessary for an explosive confrontation would be present.

There are certain conventional "safeguards" which can be used to "defuse" Sub/Dom (and S&M) group meetings, but they are almost always occasions of considerable emotional "tension".

(5), Sometimes the "conditions" laid down by the seeking couple - are so restrictive that they effectively reduce anyone else present to the status of a "sex - robot". VERY few people like being "used" in that way so those couples who constantly refuse to "compromise" should not be surprised to find themselves alone.

(6) Gay (& Lesbian) couples do have many problems peculiar to their social and living situations. T.U.S.C. does more than most to try to accomodate such needs and is always willing to listen to suggestions.

(7) Couples with one "Bi" member are far more common than is generally believed and this can produce considerable stress within subsiquent social relationships unless handled with sensitivity and great care.

(8) Couples with young children often find their extra-curricular

social activities severely "cramped" by having little (or no) privacy at home - PLUS having to find reliable "baby-sitters", we fully acknowledge this problem and DO ask others to try to make allowances, when possible to do so.

(9) Those with older children can have "even worse" problems as they might be all too aware of their parents "activities". It's a well known belief among children that "Parents" (per sec) are not "entitled" to any privacy.

Trying to keep material (& knowledge) - of any kind the "law" might define as "liable to deprave & corrupt", away from these older children can require considerable ingenuity and super-human effort. We at T.U.S.C. are fully aware of how difficult that can be and do all we can to help.

(10) It is not unusual for one partner to be a fairly experienced and committed practitioner in one (or more) of our Published areas of interest, while the other is Inexperienced, Nervous, Unsure or perhaps even slightly unwilling. We can do little to persuade "unwilling" participants But we are very happy to do what we can to reassure those with a novice interest.

(12) Where "Both" partners are novices and perhaps unsure that T.U.S.C. (& it's Published interests) are "really" to their taste, we are willing (at no cost) to "explain" anything that requires clarification.

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These 12 "situations" are matters which would be unlikely to be of particular concern to a "Single" person, whatever their interest, but we are a club which "cares" about those things which affect "all" it's members (married or single, young or old, pretty or ugly, nervous or uninhibited, experienced or novice).

As a couple you have needs and requirements peculiar to that status, as do all others to theirs.

We "Always" respond to the needs of members (& Applicants) within those activities in the "Published List".

Couples are an important part of T.U.S.C. and we are particularly responsive to your problems - those listed and any others you may have.

We do believe in honesty and fair-play so ask members to help us by telling us what they do (& don't) like. We do this initially within the "Application" form and if you do decide to join us we offer a more comprehensive (voluntary) "questionnaire" where you would be able to further express your views.

In both cases you are "encouraged" to "expand" on the range of activities and interests listed -- as it's utterly impossible for us to compile a list containing both Everything everyone likes (a lot), AND Everything everyone DIS-likes (a lot). The list would be enormous.

T.U.S.C. COULD BE "YOUR" club, there are NO paid staff and we keep overheads to a minimum.

As members you could greatly influence the subsequent direction we move in, but as a non-members you would (of course) hve no effect at all.

We all DO sincerely hope that you both decide to join us and I look forward to receiving the "Indemnity Slips" so I can dispatch the "Application Form" and other club data.
