

Peace and freedom

The small presses of the UK churn out an enormous quantity and variety of material from crude, duplicated broadsheets to professionally crafted Arts Council funded magazines.

One off-beat example is The Fox. It is published by Jenita Fox Rescue and is "devoted to the life and activities of the fox." Bi-monthly with a circulation of around 4400, it is edited by Jeannette Arnold who runs the fox rescue, and is available from her at Oak Tree, Main Road, Golden Common, near Winchester, Hampshire SO21 1TZ. Send 50p (donations welcome). This is an excellent magazine, not just for fox lovers, but for wildlife lovers everywhere.

Peace and Freedom is published quarterly and is available from Andy Bruce, 187 Grange Road, Hartlepool, Cleveland, TS26 8LX. (75p sample copy or £3 subs.) A relatively new magazine with an international readership, it is A5 size like the fox, and is crammed with reviews of underground music, interviews, much poetry, and articles and comment on environmentalism and mysticism.
