Dear DA Lacey,

I am writing in connection with the allegations made by Chloe Goins against the veteran entertainer Bill Cosby. This and the other, related allegations against Mr Cosby have received considerable publicity on this side of the Atlantic.

According to reliable media reports, Miss Goins filed a criminal complaint with Los Angeles police in January of this year making allegations relating to an alleged aggravated sexual assault against Mr Cosby at a specific venue on a specific date.

I realise the police have to investigate allegations of this nature thoroughly, but most allegations of even historical sexual abuse can be processed sufficiently in a few months, after which it should be possible to determine if there is or is not a viable case. In the UK as I am sure you know, the legal authorities release very little information prior to the conclusion of criminal proceedings; in the US, there is a far more open approach.

Bearing that in mind, can you please give me, and hopefully the rest of the media, the following information?

Has the police investigation been concluded, and if not, when is it likely to be concluded?

If it has been concluded, is there sufficient evidence to charge Mr Cosby with an offence or offences against Miss Goins?

If it has been concluded and the police conclude that the allegations made by Miss Goins are categorically false, will she be charged with filing a false report or an appropriate offence?
