## Arthur Kenneth "A.K. Chesterton" Chesterton

A.K. Chesterton was the second cousin of the literary giant G.K. Chesterton. Although born in South Africa, he was destined to become the greatest of British patriots. After attending school in England, he returned to South Africa and lied about his age to sign up with the British Army. He served on the Western Front as a officer, being awarded the Military Cross.

After the Great War he worked as a journalist in both South Africa and England, marrying Doris Terry at Kingston in 1933. The same year he joined the British Union Of Fascists and was appointed editor of its newspaper "The Blackshirt". Although like Oswald Mosley he was opposed to another senseless, fratricidal war, he enlisted in the British Army for a second time, serving in East Africa. He was invalided out due to poor health in 1943.

Post-war, Chesterton would found two organisations that were steeped in manufactured controversy from the beginning. The first was the League Of Empire Loyalists, in 1954. The second was the National Front which was smeared by left wing fanatics as Nazi, and resulted in the party and its members being subjected to both legal and at times highly illegal persecution.

In 1953, he founded the magazine "Candour" which he edited until his death. Chesterton was also an author, and his book "The New Unhappy Lords" - first published in 1965 - would become a classic exposé of power politics covering the same ground as the later "None Dare Call It Conspiracy" and the earlier "The Invisible Government", both written by American

authors although from a slightly different perspective. Later developments including admissions have confirmed the broad validity of Chesterton's thesis, namely that the super-rich, international corporations, corrupt academics, and even more corrupt politicians have been hard at work for decades creating an international network to enslave Mankind while lining their own pockets.

Chesterton was of course smeared as both a Nazi and an anti-Semite notwithstanding his antecedents. In 1948, he had collaborated with the Jewish author Joseph Leftwich on "The Tragedy Of Anti-Semitism"; he would also expel Colin Jordan [MEMORIAL ID 98560153] from the League Of Empire Loyalists.

His death was reported by a local newspaper, the "Croydon Advertiser and Croydon Times" on August 24, 1973, but appears to have been totally ignored by the mainstream media. He was cremated following his funeral at Saint Peter's Church, Croydon on August 21. Like so many advocates for the White Race including the aforementioned Colin Jordan, A.K. Chesterton died without issue. He was survived by his wife.
