

Police alerted over anti-Zionist hate pamphlet

The Board of Deputies has advised recipients of a virulently anti-Israeli pamphlet to hand it into the police.

The pamphlets have been sent to a number of Jews and non-Jews across London.

Produced by the so-called "Anglo-Hebrew Publishing" house, the pamphlet also attacks homosexuals.

As in previous literature in the name of the publishing company, the latest material claims to be acting out of a concern for the defence of Orthodox Judaism and asks the recipients to send contributions.

Among other things, the pamphlet accuses "Zionists" of being "enemies of humanity" who feel it acceptable "beat up Palestinians, throw them off the roofs of their houses and shoot their children."

Board of Deputies defence director Mike Whine said that the Board was urging recipients of the pamphlet to get in touch with their local police station.

Commenting on a separate development, he said letters sent out this week in the name of the non-existent "Red Shield — Jewish Defence Group" were far-right hoaxes.
