- NCROPA'S Freedom of Expression Bill was introduced by Ted Goodman as a precedent for our proposal for our SEXUAL FREEDOM BILL.

It was agreed to add the following to NCROPA's list

the Disorderly Houses Act;

Offences Against the Person Acts;

Clause 28 of the L.G. Act;

all acts which discriminate against gays including age of consent, number of people allowed in room where sex is taking place, marital/employment /insurance rights;

blasphemy;

the laws which restrict prostitutes rights, i.e. living off immoral earnings, shared premises, soliciting and restrictions on advertising (Tuppy to check with prostitutes attending forthcoming Prostitution Working Group).

- Written contributions to the petition's introduction were submitted by Robert, Tuppy and Tim.
- Petition As well as having the petition printed in Consenting Adults and as many other publications as possible, we will print 10,000 copies on A4 (double sided) — Tuppy to get a quote — with our logo, the title of the petition, pre-amble and actual statement, with spaces for 25 names on one side and text of the Sexual Freedom Bill on the other

Title: "SEX PLEASE — WE'RE BRITISH

Pre-Amble — general philosophy (Tuppy's contribution to be compressed by Tim) beginning with the words: "WHEREAS" followed by: "WE THE UNDERSIGNED petition the new Home Secretary to reform Britain's sex laws, by enacting the Bill

overleaf, based upon due respect for the civil liberty and choice of consenting adults, to bring Britain into line with the rest of the European Union".

More ideas welcomed.
- 7) <u>StallinSoho</u> permission to be sought to set up a small campaign table out side Paul Raymond's Review Bar on Friday and Saturday nights, to collect signatures.
- 8) <u>Budget</u> We need a limited company to avoid making SFC supporters liable for debts inadvertently incurred. A budget for doing the petition to be presented to the Plenary. Since each sheet of the petition will need to be photocopied, we should start collecting paper (could already be used on one side) for these. Jeff offered to do the photocopying and will work out costs.
- 9) <u>Getting Petition out through other Avenues</u> Everyone should compile a list and / or ask people they know who might circulate the petition through their clubs / magazines etc.
