

Sexual Freedom Coalition reorganisational proposals for 3rd year

recommended by the Steering Committee and agreed and adopted by the second AGM of May 1998 held above the Plough, Museum St, WC1.

1) The SFC will continue to seek and develop a broad and inclusive supporters' network and arrange regular opportunities for all such opinions to be democratically expressed at SFC rallies held twice or three times each year, by means of publicity, our telephone information line, and our website.

2) The SFC Steering Committee comprised of Officers and Working Group Convenors will encourage to join a subscription based membership scheme (@ £10 waged/£5 concessions per year) those individuals who have demonstrated a practical loyalty and responsibility for one or more of our adopted projects, as agreed by a simple majority provisional decision of the Steering Committee. AGM will elect a Membership Officer to administrate this.

3) All SFC members will be invited to regular members' meetings convened by decision of the Steering Committee, in order to discuss and vote upon the issues raised. As before, most decisions will be agreed by a simple majority, but new policies will require for adoption a substantial majority of two thirds of all votes cast excluding abstentions. Members will receive information bulletins between meetings, as determined by the decisions of the Steering Committee and composed by the Editor in Chief.

4).The Benefit Events Working Group under the new title Arcadia will reorganise itself on a quasi-autonomous basis to raise funds for the SFC.

SFC Aims

re-adopted without change by AGM 1998:

- * promote pansexual freedom, mutual tolerance & safer sex
 - * teach individuals, the media and authorities to revere sexual pleasure
 - * encourage mutual support of and between other adult sexual freedom campaigns, sex clubs and groups
 - * reform the sex laws which inhibit the sexual freedom of all consenting adults
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SFC Rules

re-adopted without change by AGM 1998:

- 1) The Sexual Freedom Coalition expects all its supporters, through the good liaison with the Secretariat, to avoid taking actions that could be detrimental to our confidentiality, Aims, Rules, reputation or good progress
- 2) general meetings will be open and democratic through the Chair's calling in rotation, all those indicating to speak by raising their hands, and by ruling against interruptions.
- 3) documents submitted for our approval must be accompanied by a proposing speaker willing to answer questions.
- 4) discussion of our Aims will be limited to our Annual Conferences.
- 5) the chair shall ask each general meeting whether Police or Media are present and if they will so indicate.
- 6) our broad and diverse Coalition requires that we have no insulting words or behaviour and will exclude repeating offenders.
