Police swoop on prostitutes

A prostitution crack-down in Seven Sisters is being hailed a success.

Undercover officers arrested and charged a total of 29 people this month for kerb crawling and prostitution offences and some for carrying knives.

The arrests were made as part of a series of initiatives to combat the negative impact prostitution has on the community.

Tottenham MP David Lammy is backing the initiative and has lent his support by spending time with officers on patrol.

Jonathan Davies, task force sergeant for the Seven Sisters area, said the crack-down was helping to dramatically decrease prostitution in the area.

He said: "Prostitution increases the fear of crime felt by residents. We will continue to run decoy operations in this area and use other tactics to expose kerb crawlers, urging them to stay away."
