American Airlines is to introduce a "business class" on its domestic flights. Though not unprecedented, this is unusual. The three tier system is usually reserved for international travel. The airline plans to reconfigure 10 DC-10 aircraft to include 52 business class seats in each on the New York to Los Angeles route from 4th February.
