

The Memoirs Of Marie Goodman Set For Publication

Last year, the death of one of the oldest members of the British forces was reported [here](#). Marie Goodman served as a nurse during the Second World War under the likes of the famed plastic surgeon Archibald McIndoe. The former Marie Schwartz lived an amazing life. Born in Northern France, she became a British citizen on her marriage to Englishman Eric Munday, spending time in Nigeria where he was an agent for the John Holt company. Her first husband was killed when the ship on which he was travelling was torpedoed, and on being called up for war service, she chose nursing. She met her second husband while he was a serving soldier, and after the war she became a suburban housewife.



Mrs Goodman went blind in her nineties, and her son compiled her reminiscences before they were edited into a readable format with copious notes, and photographs from a bygone era.

Her funeral service was recorded, as is the fashion nowadays. It can be found at the [Internet Archive](#) as can details of her memoirs which will be [published officially](#) on September 9, the first anniversary of her death.
