

# 'Titanic Requiem' For Italy

It's difficult to believe Robin Gibb has been dead for over three years, but the music he and his brothers created will live on long after everyone reading this has departed from this planet. According to his widow, a Bee Gees song is played somewhere in the world every 15 minutes; that is unquestionably true because there was one playing on the car radio on the drive from Norbury to Thame on the Solstice morning when Dwina Murphy-Gibb, her son RJ and a large number of others celebrated the life of their friend **Terence DuQuesne**, who died last year.

Although the forte of the Bee Gees was commercial music, the last major project on which Robin worked was his *Titanic Requiem*. Co-written with RJ, it is something entirely different, a memorial to one of the most infamous maritime disasters in history, composed for the centenary of the tragedy. **This interview** with father and son was recorded shortly before Robin's death; he was clearly seriously ill at the time.
