
## Can The Soaps Get Any Sillier?

How many resurrections are there in the *New Testament?* Lazarus and the Great JC himself. To date there have been three in *EastEnders*: the landlord of the local watering hole; one of Albert Square's villains; and most recently the mother of one of its small businessmen. The first two have since been killed off permanently, but if that isn't silly enough, now we have a man framed for murder after a young woman with whom he'd had a fling was killed albeit accidentally by her ten year old brother, and best not to mention the transvestite undertaker whose grandson was nearly caught having queer sex with one of the local wide boys in the embalming room.

*EastEnders* is based largely on a square and market; another leading soap, *Coronation Street* – the longest running such series in the UK – is based largely on that one street.
