

Westminster Paedophile Ring Fantasies Continue

Channel 4 television has broadcast an interview with a man who claims he was sexually abused by **a gang of paedophiles** at the heart of the Westminster establishment. He claims too he was warned by detectives to stop talking about Kincorra.



The Kincorra Boys Home scandal is well-documented; the home was set up in 1958, and catered for boys from troubled backgrounds. In 1980, three members of its staff were charged with sexually abusing boys in their care, and were subsequently gaoled for 4, 5 and 6 years respectively.

That was bad enough, but it was nowhere near bad enough for the press, which wanted to find a paedophile ring at the heart of the scandal. The grain of truth in these claims is that one of those convicted, William McGrath, was a prominent Ulster Loyalist, and had some vague connections with the security services.

Richard Kerr, the man Channel 4 interviewed, is a former resident of the Kincorra home, of that much we can be certain, but his other claims, that he was sexually abused at the notorious *Elm Guest House*, and that he was “trafficked” to various parts of the UK where he and other boys were raped by powerful homosexuals, have the whiff of fantasy about them.

He claims to be living in fear still, and he looks like a nervous wreck, but from the limited information given it is clear that although he was not a victim of systematic and prolonged abuse, he is a victim, and does have a sad tale to tell.

Mr Kerr is now living in the United States, and we are told was flown over here by Channel 4 with his counsellor – that word says it all. He is working on his memory, read working to “recover” memories that do not exist because the events to which they relate never happened. By his own admission, he worked as a male prostitute for some time, a rent boy. This begs the question, how did he ever gain admission to the United States, and who has been providing his livelihood?

So what did happen? There used to be a widely held belief that the streets of London were paved with gold, something that has been said of many other great cities. It is most likely that Mr Kerr made his way to the English capital from Northern Ireland on his own initiative, and once there realised that for a young man with no marketable skills and a troubled family background the only ways to make easy money were either illegal or quasi-legal, so he chose the latter. Al Stewart wrote a song about this in 1967, *Pretty Golden Hair*.

Having fallen into the grip of prostitution, he has paid a terrible price. For women and girls, prostitution at the lower end of the market can take a heavy toll; in some ways it can be even worse for men, because a man who drops his trousers for other men barter away part of his manhood. Like the women who are now **accusing Bill Cosby** of drugging and raping them, Mr Kerr has been reconstructing history in his mind to blame someone else

for his folly, and in this he is being aided by a counsellor, but again, who is footing the bill? Quite likely the kind of people who profit from perpetuating this nonsense, though not necessarily in a financial sense. In fact there was a hint of this when he was taken to meet someone who was working in Northern Ireland at the time of the Kincorra scandal. In short, unlike the Cosby affair, this is not a feminist fantasy but a Christian fundamentalist one. Don't be too surprised if in the weeks to come we hear more about **Devil worship** than paedophilia, fueled by the likes of the credulous journalist from Channel 4 who swallowed Mr Kerr's gobbledegook like the nodding dog she is.
