N.B. A candidate wishing to claim matriculation and having attained the age of 16 years must (i) return this statement to the Syndicate (the necessary certification will then be sent direct to the authorities of the University of London, for their use only); (ii) send the registration fee of three guineas (£3. 3s.) to the Accountant, University of London, London, W.C. 1, accompanied by the Birth Certificate or other official documentary evidence of age and full name.

No matriculation certificate is issued by the University of London to candidates who claim exemption in virtue of an examination conducted by another examining body, but the University of London will officially notify such candidates of their matriculation.
